Service Animals - Service animals are the only animals admitted. Dress - Silver Dollar City is a family-friendly environment and requires appropriate dress. Although some of our rides and attractions may get you wet, we request that swimsuits be limited to children 8 and under only. While on rides, children 8 and under will be asked to wear shorts over swimwear; all others wearing swimsuits will be required to wear an appropriate coverup at all will be required to wear an appropriate coverup at all times. Guests wearing clothing that may be offensive or inappropriate (including profanity or suggestive material) will be asked to change. Shirts & shoes must be worn at all times. The use of shoes with built-in skates or wheels is prohibited. We reserve the right to refuse admission to anyone not properly attired, and appreciate your help in keeping our City a great place for families to visit. Line Jumping - Line jumping or saving a space in line is strictly prohibited and may result in dismissal from the park without compensation. Smoking - For the convenience of smokers and non-smokers, smoking is not permitted in our City except in designated areas. This includes, but is not limited to, inside any building, ride lines, venue lines, and walkways. There are 12 Designated Smoking Areas located throughout the City as indicated on the map Accholic Beverges - Not permitted anywhere on Silver Dollar City property. Firearms - Firearms and weapons of any type are prohibited on Silver Dollar City property. Before Enjoying our Rides - For your safety, some rides have height, health, size and/or age restrictions.
